

Slug

Sea slugs have an enormous variation in body shape, color, and size. Most are partially translucent. The often-bright colors of reef-dwelling species imply that these animals are under constant threat of predators. The color can warn other animals of the sea slug's toxic stinging cells (nematocysts) or offensive taste. Like all gastropods, they have small, razor-sharp teeth called radulas. Most sea slugs have a pair of rhinophores—sensory tentacles used primarily for the sense of smell—on their head, with a small eye at the base of each rhinophore. Many have feathery structures (cerata) on the back, often in a contrasting color, which act as gills. == Gameplay == A slug is distinct from a B unit, which has both a prime mover and traction motors but no cab. == Taxonomy ==

Various taxonomic families of land slugs form part of several quite different evolutionary lineages, which also include snails. Thus, the various families of slugs are not closely related, despite the superficial similarity in overall body form.
