

The Gardening Book

Two pioneers of the method in the twentieth century included F. C. Guest, who in 1948 published... The work was a collection of old material from a variety of sources, translated into English. Miles Hadfield described it as the work of a journalist rather than a practical gardener. This technique recognizes that micro- and macro-biotic organisms constitute a "food web" community in the soil, necessary for the healthy cycling of nutrients and prevention of problematic organisms and diseases. Amateur Gardening was founded in London in May 1884 by Shirley Hibberd, who edited it until 1887. At the time of the magazine's brief closure in 2023 (see below), it was the oldest UK gardening weekly magazine,

and was Britain's bestseller in that category in 2013. The magazine was published once a week. Its editorial offices were in Farnborough, Hampshire. At the time of the magazine's launch in 1884 there had been several other notable gardening magazines in circulation, including the *Gardeners' Chronicle* and *Gardens Illustrated*, but these were tailored more to the professional gardener. *Amateur Gardening* is considered the first paper designed specifically for the amateur.
