In contemporary philosophy a distinction has developed between the speculative philosophy of history and the critical philosophy of history, now referred to as analytic. The split between these approaches may be approximately compared, by analogy and on the strength of regional and academic influences, to the schism in commitments between analytic and continental philosophy wherein the analytic approach is pragmatic and the speculative approach attends more closely to a metaphysics (or anti-metaphysics) of determining forces like language or the phenomenology of perception at the level of background assumptions. 6d2912c95c

Mind in Eastern philosophy Dualism and monism are the two central schools of thought on the mind-body problem in the Western tradition, although nuanced views have arisen that do not fit one or the other category neatly.
