Presumption of innocence The prosecution must in most cases prove that the accused is guilty beyond a reasonable doubt. The presumption means: With respect to the critical facts The presumption of innocence is a legal principle that every person accused of any crime is considered innocent until proven guilty. protection is maintained, a set of three related rules govern the procedure of criminal trials. The opposite system is a presumption of guilt. Under the presumption of innocence, the legal burden of proof is thus on the prosecution, which must present compelling evidence to the trier of fact (a judge or a jury). If reasonable doubt remains, the accused must be acquitted. If the prosecution does not prove the charges true, then the person is acquitted of the charges

Judiciary of France There are three tiers to each court: the inferior court, the intermediate appellate court and the court of last resort. Serge Guinchard The judiciary of France is the court system, administrated by the Minister of Justice, of France. The intermediate appellate court hears cases on appeal from the inferior court, and the court of last resort hears appeals from the intermediate appellate courts.
