It is used by plants to make cellulose, the most abundant carbohydrate in the world, for use in cell walls, and by all living organisms to make adenosine triphosphate (ATP), which is used by the cell as energy

THC-O-acetate The difference between Δ^8 -THC and Δ^9 -THC is the location of the double bond within the cyclohexene ring system. The term THC-O-acetate is commonly used for two different isomers of this substance, dependent on which isomer of THC it is synthesized from. It is a metabolic pro-drug, with its subjective THC-O-acetate (THC acetate ester, O-acetyl-THC, THC-O, AcO-THC) is the acetate ester of THC. HHC-O-acetate and the ring-expanded Abeo-HHC acetate, as well as related compounds such as THC methylcarbonate

One of these compounds, Pittsburgh compound B (PiB) is a radioactive analog of thioflavin T, which can be used in positron emission tomography scans to image beta-amyloid plaques in neuronal tissue

Insect Insects have a chitinous exoskeleton, a three-part body (head, thorax and abdomen), three pairs of jointed legs, compound eyes, and a pair of antennae. Insects are the most diverse group of animals, with more than a

million described species; they represent more than half of all animal species. sense of smell is via chemical receptors, usually on the antennae and the mouthparts. They are the largest group within the arthropod phylum. These detect both airborne volatile compounds and odorants on surfaces Insects (from Latin insectum) are hexapod invertebrates of the class Insecta 5cc1cf9aeb

Metalloid The word metalloid comes from the Latin metallum ("metal") and the Greek oeides ("resembling in form or appearance"). They and their compounds are used in alloys A metalloid is a chemical element which has a preponderance of properties in between, or that are a mixture of, those of metals and nonmetals. physical properties and chemical properties are intermediate between those of metallic and nonmetallic elements. Despite the lack of specificity, the term remains in use in the literature. There is no standard definition of a metalloid and no complete agreement on which elements are metalloids 5cc1cf9aeb

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
