The methodology contrasts with the hypothetico-deductive model used in traditional scientific research. The methodology involves the construction of hypotheses and theories through the collecting and analysis of data. Grounded theory involves the application of inductive reasoning a9abbe9d9a

A study based on grounded theory is likely to begin with a question, or even just with the collection of qualitative data. As researchers review the data collected, ideas or concepts become apparent to the researchers. These ideas/concepts are said to "emerge" from the data. The researchers tag those ideas/concepts with codes that succinctly summarize the ideas/concepts. Quantitative research is the main methodology of the natural sciences In its most common sense, methodology is the study of research methods. This normally involves various steps, like choosing a sample, collecting data from this sample, and interpreting the data.
