Bryce DeWitt popularized the formulation and named it many-worlds in the 1970s. The evolution of reality as a whole in MWI is rigidly deterministic and local. This implies that all possible outcomes of quantum measurements are physically realized in different "worlds". It is one of a number of multiverse hypotheses in physics and philosophy
