Hadamard matrix Certain In mathematics, an Hadamard matrix, named after the French mathematician Jacques Hadamard, is a square matrix whose entries are either $+1$ or -1 and whose rows are mutually orthogonal. among matrices with entries of absolute value less than or equal to 1 and so is an extremal solution of Hadamard's maximal determinant problem. It is a consequence of this definition that the corresponding properties hold for columns as well as rows. In geometric terms, this means that each pair of rows in a Hadamard matrix represents two perpendicular vectors, while in combinatorial terms, it means that each pair of rows has matching entries in exactly half of their

columns and mismatched entries in the remaining columns
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The terminology can be described in terms of the concept of constraint counting. Each unknown can be seen as an available degree of freedom.
