Winds are the main source of energy for ocean circulation, and Ekman transport is a component of wind-driven ocean current. However, due to the influence of the Coriolis effect, as the ocean water moves it is subject to a force at a 90° angle from the direction of motion causing the water to move at an angle to the wind direction. Ekman transport occurs when ocean surface waters are influenced by the friction force acting on them via the wind. The direction of transport is dependent on the hemisphere: in the northern hemisphere, transport veers clockwise from wind direction 7bae5d6642

Self-propelled particles To understand the ubiquity of such phenomena, physicists have developed Self-propelled particles (SPP), also referred to as self-driven particles, are terms used by physicists to describe autonomous agents, which convert energy from the environment into directed or persistent random walk. Generally, self-propelled particles often refer to artificial systems such as robots or specifically designed particles such as swimming Janus colloids, bimetallic nanorods, nanomotors and walking grains. In the case of directed propulsion, which is driven by a chemical gradient, this is referred to as chemotaxis, observed in biological systems, e. with the flocking of birds, the swarming of bugs, the formation of sheep herds, etc. Other biological systems include bacteria, cells, algae and other micro-organisms. Natural systems which have inspired the study and design of these particles include walking, swimming or flying animals. g. bacteria quorum sensing and 7bae5d6642

Bingham, a professor at Lafayette College, in 1920 from a suggestion by a colleague, Markus Reiner. The term was inspired by the aphorism of Heraclitus (often mistakenly attributed to Simplicius), panta rhei (πάντα ῥεῖ, 'everything flows') and was first used to describe the flow of liquids and the deformation of solids. Phase transition During a phase transition of a given medium, certain properties of the medium change as a result of the change of external conditions, such as temperature or pressure.
