Replacing A flipped classroom is an instructional strategy and a type of blended learning. With a flipped classroom, students watch online lectures, collaborate in online discussions, or carry out research at home, while actively engaging concepts in the classroom with a mentor's guidance. The latter happens in class and in person. This pedagogical style moves activities, including those that may have traditionally been considered homework, into the classroom. Flipped mastery eliminates two other out-of-class routines: daily lesson planning and grading papers b37dc025a4
