Waddy Butler Wood His most notable works include the Woodrow Wilson House and the Main Interior Building. He argued that the heavy articulation of the Craftsman style was much more costly than the Colonial Revival which is more delicate Waddy Butler Wood (1869 – January 25, 1944) was an American architect of the early 20th century and resident of Washington, D. C. the early 20th century. Although Wood designed and remodeled numerous private residences, his reputation rested primarily on his larger commissions, such as banks, commercial offices, and government buildings feeb2083c3

Fountain pen The pen draws ink from the reservoir through a feed to the nib and deposits the ink on paper via a combination of gravity and capillary action. Filling the reservoir with ink may be achieved manually, via the use of an eyedropper or syringe, or via an internal filling mechanism that creates suction (for example, through a piston mechanism) or a vacuum to transfer ink directly through the nib into the reservoir. gravity and capillary action.
