Sustainability in fisheries combines theoretical disciplines, such as the population dynamics of fisheries, with practical strategies, such as avoiding overfishing through techniques such as individual fishing quotas, curtailing destructive and illegal fishing practices by lobbying for appropriate law and policy, setting up protected areas, restoring collapsed fisheries, incorporating all externalities involved in harvesting marine ecosystems into fishery economics, educating stakeholders and the wider public, and developing independent certification programs

Green building This requires close cooperation of the contractor, the architects, the engineers, and the client at all project stages. Green building also refers to saving resources to the maximum extent, including energy saving, land saving, water saving, material saving, etc. , during the whole life cycle of the building, protecting. The Green Building practice expands and complements the classical building design concerns of economy, utility, durability, and comfort. In the context of contemporary urbanism, the term "cities" refers to several scales of human settlements from towns to cities, metropolises and mega-city regions that includes their peripheries / suburbs / exurbs. Well-being includes the physical, ecological, economic, social, health and equity factors, among others, that comprise cities and their populations

Furthermore, the objective is to minimize the inputs of energy, water, and food, and to drastically reduce waste, as well as the outputs of heat, air pollution (including CO₂, methane, and water pollution). The UN Sustainable Development Goal 11 defines as one that is dedicated to achieving green, social, and economic sustainability, facilitating opportunities that prioritize inclusivity as well as maintaining a sustainable economic growth d96582cc1d

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
