**Self-organization** It is often triggered by seemingly random fluctuations, amplified by positive feedback. The resulting organization is wholly decentralized, distributed over all the components of the system. Chaos theory discusses self-organization in terms of islands of predictability in a sea of chaotic unpredictability. The process can be spontaneous when sufficient energy is available, not needing control by any external agent. As such, the organization is typically robust and able to survive or self-repair substantial perturbation.
