Way received the Xeric Grant in 2000 for his debut publication, Violent Lifestyle. Through Violent Lifestyle, Way was introduced to Marvel Comics editor Axel Alonso, who hired Way for a Deathlok mini-series that was cancelled prior to publication. After Deadpool appeared in a Wolverine: Origins storyline, Way launched a new ongoing Deadpool series with artist Paco Medina.
