Gautier wrote, "Berlioz represents the romantic musical idea ... unexpected effects in sound, tumultuous and Shakespearean depth of passion." It is possible that Berlioz read Gautier's collection *La comédie de la mort* (The Comedy of Death) before its publication in 1838. Gautier had no objection to his friend's setting six poems from that volume, and Berlioz began in March 1840. The title *Nuits d'été* was Berlioz's invention, and it is not clear why... 0a14bfe035

Dormoy was born Marie-Léonie Graftieaux, the eldest child of Alexis Léon Graftieaux and Marie Catherine Echard. The family was from the tiny village of Deville, in northeastern France. As a child, her parents sent her to Paris, to live with her paternal grandparents, the Dormoys. She became friends with the daughters of the couturier Paul Poiret. When they visited his atelier, Marie-Léonie became interested in fashion and, when she was just 12, she began working part-time for Poiret, doing odd jobs in the workroom. By the time she finished school, she was one of his models. She had also learned a considerable amount about clothing design and construction—enough that, when Madeleine Vionnet opened her fashion house in 1912, she hired Marie-Léonie as a seamstress.
