Human rights in Saudi Arabia The government system concentrates authority within the monarchy, which has drawn international attention and criticism over restrictions on political and civil liberties. The government is consistently ranked among the "worst of the worst" in Freedom House's annual survey of political and civil rights and was in 2023 ranked as the world's most authoritarian regime.
