Ethylene oxide Ethylene oxide is a colorless and flammable gas with a faintly sweet odor. making many consumer products as well as non-consumer chemicals and intermediates. These products include detergents, thickeners, solvents, plastics, Ethylene oxide is an organic compound with the formula C_2H_4O . Ethylene oxide is isomeric with acetaldehyde and with vinyl alcohol. Because it is a strained ring, ethylene oxide easily participates in a number of addition reactions that result in ring-opening. Ethylene oxide is industrially produced by oxidation of ethylene in the presence of a silver catalyst. It is a cyclic ether and the simplest epoxide: a three-membered ring consisting of one oxygen atom and two carbon atoms 22c49b6911

Balance wheel The combination. It is a weighted wheel that rotates back and forth, being returned toward its center position by a spiral torsion spring, known as the balance spring or hairspring. It is driven by the escapement, which transforms the rotating motion of the watch gear train into impulses delivered to the balance wheel. The balance wheel and hairspring together form a harmonic oscillator, which due to resonance oscillates preferentially at a certain rate, its resonant frequency or "beat", and resists oscillating at other rates. spring keep the time between each oscillation or "tick"; very constant, accounting for its nearly universal use as the timekeeper in mechanical watches to A balance wheel, or balance, is the timekeeping device used in mechanical watches and small clocks, analogous to the pendulum in a pendulum clock.
