Medical ethics More recently Medical ethics is an applied branch of ethics which analyzes the practice of clinical medicine and related scientific research. Such tenets may allow doctors, care providers, and families to create a treatment plan and work towards the same common goal. Medical ethics is based on a set of values that professionals can refer to in the case of

any confusion or conflict. patients, an ethical question arose on which patients to treat and which ones not to treat, and which factors to use in making such a decision. These values include the respect for autonomy, non-maleficence, beneficence, and justice. These four values are not ranked in order of importance or relevance and they all encompass values pertaining to medical ethics. However, a conflict may arise leading to the need for hierarchy in an ethical system, such that some moral elements overrule others with the purpose of applying the best moral judgement to a difficult medical situation

Impact investing can be considered a subset of SRI that is generally more proactive and focused on the conscious creation of social or environmental impact through investment. Eco-investing (or green investing) is SRI with a focus on environmentalism. It is a viral vector vaccine based on a human adenovirus that has been modified to contain the gene for making the spike protein of the SARS-CoV-2 virus that causes COVID-19. The body's immune system responds to this spike protein to produce antibodies. The vaccine requires only one dose and does not need to be stored frozen.

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Informed consent This principle applies more broadly than healthcare intervention, for example to conduct research, to disclose a person's medical information, or to participate in high risk sporting and recreational activities.
