Fertilization occurs when the sperm cell successfully enters and fuses with an egg cell (ovum). At the beginning of the ninth week, the embryo is termed a fetus (spelled "foetus. It is characterised by the processes of cell division and cellular differentiation of the embryo that occurs during the early stages of development.

The genetic material of the sperm and egg then combine to form the single cell zygote and the germinal stage of development commences. Human embryonic development covers the first eight weeks of development, which have 23 stages, called Carnegie stages. In biological terms, the development of the human body entails growth from a one-celled zygote to an adult human being

Systema Naturae The full title of the 10th edition (1758), which was the most important one, was *Systema naturæ per regna tria naturæ, secundum classes, ordines, genera, species, cum characteribus, differentiis, synonymis, locis*, which appeared in English in 1806 with the title: "A General System of Nature, Through the Three Grand Kingdoms of Animals, Vegetables. The first edition was published in 1735. In 1766-1768 Linnaeus published the much enhanced 12th edition, the last under his authorship. Another again enhanced work in the same *Systema Naturae* (originally in Latin written *Systema Naturæ* with the ligature æ) is one of the major works of the Swedish botanist, zoologist and physician Carl Linnaeus (1707-1778) and introduced the Linnaean taxonomy. Although the system, now known as binomial nomenclature, was

partially developed by the Bauhin brothers, Gaspard and Johann, Linnaeus was the first to use it consistently throughout his book. zoological nomenclature d1bad5548f
