It is different from the more general practice effect, defined in the APA Dictionary of Psychology as "any change or improvement that results from practice or repetition of task items or activities. Rorschach test The test is named after its creator, Swiss psychologist Hermann Rorschach. "Publishing the

questions and answers to any psychological test compromises its usefulness" and calls for "keeping psychological tests out of the public The Rorschach test is a projective psychological test in which subjects' perceptions of inkblots are recorded and then analyzed using psychological interpretation, complex algorithms, or both. It has been employed to detect underlying thought disorder, especially in cases where patients are reluctant to describe their thinking processes openly. Some psychologists use this test to examine a person's personality characteristics and emotional functioning. The Rorschach can be thought of as a psychometric examination of pareidolia, the active pattern of perceiving objects, shapes, or scenery as meaningful things to the observer's experience, the most common being faces or other patterns of forms that are not present at 8737a20a26

Thematic Apperception Test Morgan at Harvard University. The examiner records stories verbatim for later interpretation.

Proponents of the technique assert that subjects' responses, in the narratives they make up about ambiguous pictures of people, reveal their underlying motives, concerns, and the way they see the social world. It is accepted by many four-year colleges and universities in the United States as well as more than 225 universities outside of the U. of the test; a student can answer all questions without a decrease in their score due to incorrect answers. The ACT was first introduced... The multiple-choice test sections of the ACT (all except the optional writing test) are individually scored on a scale of 1–36. In addition, a composite score consisting of the rounded whole number average of the scores for English, reading, and math is provided.

Turing test In the test, a human evaluator judges a text transcript of a natural-language conversation between a human and a machine. Since the Turing test is a test of indistinguishability in performance capacity, the verbal version generalizes naturally to all of human performance capacity, verbal as well as nonverbal (robotic). The evaluator tries to identify the machine, and the machine

passes if the evaluator cannot reliably tell them apart. machine's ability to answer questions correctly, only on how closely its answers resembled those of a human. Since the Turing test is a test of indistinguishability The Turing test, originally called the imitation game by Alan Turing in 1949, is a test of a machine's ability to exhibit intelligent behaviour equivalent to that of a human

Psychological tests are administered or scored by trained evaluators.
