

Chapter 6 Random Variables Continuous Case

For instance, if X is used to denote the outcome of a coin toss ("the experiment"), then the probability distribution of X would take the value 0.5 (1 in 2 or $1/2$) for $X = \text{heads}$, and 0.5 for $X = \text{tails}$ (assuming that the coin is fair). More commonly, probability distributions are used to compare the relative occurrence of many different random values. e72c130cbb which starts at 0, and at each step moves $+1$ or -1 with equal probability. Other examples include the path traced by a molecule as it travels in a liquid or a gas (see Brownian motion), the search path of a foraging animal, or the price of a fluctuating stock and the financial status of a gambler. Random walk walk formally, take independent random variables $Z_1, Z_2, \dots$ $\{\displaystyle Z_{\{1\}}, Z_{\{2\}}, \dots\}$, where each variable is either 1 or -1 , with a 50% probability

In mathematics, a random walk, sometimes known as a drunkard's walk, is a stochastic process that describes a path that consists of a succession of random steps on some mathematical space

For simple linear regression the effect is an underestimate of the coefficient, known as the attenuation bias. probability, convergence in distribution In probability theory, there exist several different notions of convergence of sequences of random variables, including convergence in probability, convergence in distribution, and almost sure convergence. This is a weaker notion than convergence in probability, which tells us about the value a random variable will take, rather than just the distribution

Probability density function While the absolute likelihood for a continuous random variable to take on any particular value is zero, given there is an infinite set of possible values to begin with. Suppose In probability theory, a probability density function (PDF), density function, or density of an absolutely continuous random variable, is a function whose value at any given sample (or point) in the sample space (the set of possible values taken by the random variable) can be interpreted as providing a relative likelihood that the value of the random variable would be equal to that sample. Probability density is the probability per unit length, in other

words. Therefore, the value of the PDF at two different samples can be used to infer, in any particular draw of the random variable, how much more likely it is that the random. discrete random variables (random variables that take values on a countable set), while the PDF is used in the context of continuous random variables

Exchangeable random variables Formally In statistics, an exchangeable sequence of random variables (also sometimes interchangeable) is a sequence $X_1, X_2, X_3, \dots$. In other words,

the joint distribution is invariant to finite permutation. (which may be finitely or infinitely long) whose joint probability distribution does not change when the positions in the sequence in which finitely many of them appear are altered. identically distributed random variables in statistical models.

Expected value The above discussion of continuous random variables is thus a special case of the general Lebesgue In probability theory, the expected value (also called expectation, expectancy, expectation operator, mathematical expectation, mean, expectation value, or first moment) is a generalization of the weighted average. Informally, the expected value is the mean of the possible values a random variable can take, weighted by the probability of those outcomes. $\int x f(x) dx$ for any absolutely continuous random variable X . Since it is obtained through arithmetic, the expected value sometimes may not even be included in the sample data set; it is not the value you would expect to get in reality
