pioneering diver of the early 20th century, raised in the Swedish town of Ockelbo, "a little village in the pine forests of Gestrückland" according to a description in *Pearl Diver*. After his father died at a young age, he eventually went to sea, where he spent the next forty years diving in the Pacific. accompanied the story, "The Terror of the Deep", co-authored by Victor Berge and Henry Wysham Lanier). After the war he returned to Sweden, where he died in 1974 in Stockholm. One of the early classics of diving literature. Two books chronicle his life, *Pearl Diver* (1930), which covers his life up to 1930 or so, and *Danger is My Life* (1954), which chronicles his life up to that point, and through World War II (when he was captured and imprisoned by the Japanese). Austro-Hungarian occupation of Serbia Austria-Hungary's declaration of war against Serbia on 28 July 1914 marked the beginning of the war. It was ruled by the Military General Governorate of Serbia (MGG/S), an administration established by the Austro-Hungarian The Austro-Hungarian Armed Forces occupied Serbia from late 1915 until the end of World War I. After three unsuccessful Austro-Hungarian offensives between August and December 1914, a combined Austro-Hungarian and German offensive breached the Serbian front from the north and west in October 1915, while Bulgaria attacked from the east. the northern three-quarters of Serbia. By January 1916, all of Serbia had been occupied by the Central Powers

Etymologiae surviving manuscript preserves a fragment of book XI from the 7th century. , is an etymological encyclopedia compiled by the influential Christian bishop Isidore of Seville (c. 560–636) towards the end of his life. Isidore was encouraged to write the book by his friend Braulio, Bishop of Saragossa. *Etymologiae* summarized and organized a wealth of knowledge from hundreds of classical sources; three of its books are derived largely from Pliny the Elder's *Natural History*. Isidore acknowledges Pliny, but not his other principal sources, namely Cassiodorus, Servius, and Gaius Julius Solinus. *Etymologiae* was printed in at least ten editions between 1472 and 1530, after which *Etymologiae* (Latin for 'Etymologies'), also known as the *Origines* ('Origins'), usually abbreviated *Orig*
