Several languages have multiple translations, with Italian having nine versions and Portuguese six. James Joyce's novel Ulysses (1922) has been translated into at least 43 languages. It is one of the oldest surviving works of literature and remains popular with modern audiences. Like the Iliad, the Odyssey is divided into 24 books. However, following the Norman Conquest of England in 1066, the written form of the Anglo-Saxon language became less common. The earliest forms of English, a set of Anglo-Frisian dialects brought to Great Britain by Anglo-Saxon settlers in the fifth century, are called Old English. Then in 1922 Irishman James Joyce's important modernist novel Ulysses appeared. This form of English lasted. Despite being set in Scandinavia, it has achieved national epic status in England.
