It started service. Three other airlines (Braniff, Trans-Texas, and Continental) sued to prevent the company from starting up. The company planned to operate as an intrastate airline, flying a Texas Triangle network between Dallas, Houston, and San Antonio. In 1975, Southwest began flying to other cities in Texas, and in 1979, after passage of the Airline Deregulation Act, it began flying to adjacent states. In 1967.
