A heavy, silvery d-block element, mercury is the only metallic element that is known to be liquid at standard temperature and pressure; the only other element that is liquid under these conditions is the halogen bromine, though metals such as caesium, gallium, and rubidium melt just above room temperature. Plastic recycling Under the convention, any Party can decide to prohibit imports of hazardous plastic waste and, Plastic recycling is the

processing of plastic waste into other products. Recycling rates lag behind those of other recoverable materials, such as aluminium, glass and paper. 3 billion tonnes of plastic waste, only 9% of which has been recycled and only ~1% has been recycled more than once. Recycling can reduce dependence on landfills, conserve resources and protect the environment from plastic pollution and greenhouse gas emissions. Of the remaining waste, 12% was incinerated and 79% was either sent to landfills or lost to the environment as pollution. plastic waste became regulated under the Basel Convention. From the start of plastic production through to 2015, the world produced around 6 d393a8eaab
