

# Georges Perec A Void

Oulipo It was founded in 1960 by Raymond Queneau and François Le Lionnais. As well as established techniques, such as lipograms (Perec’s novel A Void) and palindromes, the group devises new methods, often based on mathematical Oulipo (French pronunciation: [ulipo], short for French: Ouvroir de littérature potentielle; roughly translated as "workshop of potential literature", stylized OuLiPo) is a loose gathering of (mainly) French-speaking writers and mathematicians who seek to create works using constrained writing techniques.
