Pez was invented in Austria and later exported worldwide. T200 Fatima The 'T200' designation comes from the American Card Catalogue, an authoritative guide to trading cards issued prior to 1951. Cigarette packs often contain warning messages depending on which country they are sold in. Pez The first PEZ mint dispensers, known as "regulars", were similar in shape to a cigarette Pez (English: , German: [pe:ts]; stylised as PEZ) is the brand name of an Austrian candy and associated manual candy dispensers. The candy is a pressed, dry, straight-edged, curved-corner block 15 mm (5⁄8 inch) long, 8 mm (5⁄16 inch) wide and 5 mm (3⁄16 inch) high, with each Pez dispenser holding 12 candy pieces. to a small tin to hold the mints, similar to the modern Altoids tins cd22dff86b

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
