Cognitive interview Studies have shown that interviewing techniques such as asking leading questions and closed-ended The cognitive interview (CI) is a method of interviewing eyewitnesses and victims about what they remember from a crime scene. Cognitive interviews reliably enhance the process of memory retrieval and have been found to elicit memories without generating inaccurate accounts or confabulations. The interview aids in minimizing both misinterpretation and the uncertainty that is otherwise seen in the questioning process of traditional police interviews. Cognitive interviews are increasingly used in police investigations, and training programs and manuals have been created. and vulnerable to suggestions during the interviewing process. Using four retrievals, the primary focus of the cognitive interview is to make

witnesses and victims of a situation aware of all the events that transpired
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Clean language interviewing clean questions, set frames, contain presuppositions and invite the interviewee to attend to certain aspects of his or her experience. Clean questions aim Clean language interviewing (CLI), sometimes shortened to clean interviewing, aims to maximise the reliability that information collected during an interview derives from the interviewee. CLI seeks to address some of the "threats to validity and reliability" that can occur during an interview and to increase the "trustworthiness" of the data collected. It does this by employing a technique that minimises the unintended introduction of interviewer content, assumption, leading question structure, presupposition, framing, priming, tacit metaphor and nonverbal aspects such as paralanguage and gesture that may compromise the authenticity of the data collected aa693d2afe
