Hubbard claimed to have developed it from a combination of personal experience, basic principles of Eastern philosophy and the work of Sigmund Freud. It is colloquially referred to by Scientologists as Book One. As of 2013, the Scientology organization's publishing arm, New Era Publications, sells the book in English and in 50 other languages.
