Neuromodulation [citation needed] Selective serotonin Neuromodulation is the physiological process by which a given neuron uses one or more chemicals to regulate diverse populations of neurons. This modulation can last for hundreds of milliseconds to several minutes. Neuromodulators typically bind to metabotropic, G-protein coupled receptors (GPCRs) to initiate a second messenger signaling cascade that induces a broad, long-lasting signal. acts on serotonin receptors. Some of the effects of neuromodulators include altering intrinsic firing activity, increasing or decreasing voltage-dependent currents, altering synaptic efficacy, increasing bursting activity and reconfiguring synaptic connectivity. In the peripheral nervous system (such as in the gut wall) serotonin regulates vascular tone 550805dbcc

Hypoxia (medicine) local hypoxia is gangrene that occurs in diabetes. Symptoms are worse when Hypoxia is a condition in which the body or a region of the body is deprived of an adequate oxygen supply at the tissue level. Although hypoxia is often a pathological condition, variations in arterial oxygen concentrations can be part of the normal physiology, for example, during strenuous physical exercise. Diseases such as peripheral vascular disease can also result in local hypoxia. Hypoxia may be classified as either

Blood pressure Blood pressure is usually expressed in terms of the systolic pressure (maximum pressure during one heartbeat) over diastolic pressure (minimum pressure between two heartbeats) in the cardiac cycle. It is measured in millimetres of mercury (mmHg) above the surrounding atmospheric pressure, or in kilopascals (kPa). When used without qualification, the term "blood pressure" refers to the pressure in a brachial artery, where it is most commonly measured. plays an important role in intensive care medicine but requires invasive measurement of pressure using a catheter. Most of this pressure results from the heart pumping blood through the circulatory system. Venous pressure is the vascular pressure Blood pressure (BP) is the pressure of circulating blood against the walls of blood vessels. The difference between the systolic and diastolic pressures is known as pulse pressure, while the average pressure during a cardiac cycle is known as mean arterial 550805dbcc

About 90–95% of cases are primary, defined as high blood pressure due to non-specific lifestyle and genetic factors. In the systemic circulation, arteries carry oxygenated blood away from the heart, and veins return deoxygenated blood to the heart, in the deep veins. Most veins carry deoxygenated blood from the tissues back to the heart; exceptions are those of the pulmonary and fetal

circulations which carry oxygenated blood to the heart.
