Jon Kleinberg published his work on HITS. The underlying assumption is that more important websites are likely to receive more links from other websites. Google's founders cite Garfield, Marchiori, and Kleinberg in their original papers. PageRank is a way of measuring the importance of website pages. As of September 24, 2019, all patents associated with PageRank have expired. According to Google: PageRank works by counting the number and quality of links to a page to determine a rough estimate of how important the website is. It is named after both the term "web page" and co-founder Larry Page.
