Double negative Languages where multiple negatives affirm each other are said to have negative concord or emphatic negation. Multiple negation is the more general term referring to the occurrence of more than one negative in a clause. This is typically used to convey a different shade of meaning from a strictly positive sentence ("You're not unattractive" vs "You're attractive"). In some languages, double negatives cancel one another and produce an affirmative; in other languages, doubled negatives intensify the negation. as 1762, when Bishop Robert Lowth wrote *A Short Introduction to English Grammar with Critical Notes*.
