Continuous station operations were manual, requiring local engineering staff, until automation debuted Radio broadcasting has been used in the United States since the early 1920s to distribute news and entertainment to a national audience. Amateur radio in India The three decades after India's independence saw only slow growth in the number of operators until the then Prime Minister of India and amateur radio operator, Rajiv Gandhi (VU2RG), waived the import duty on wireless equipment in 1984. The first amateur radio operator was licensed in 1921, and by the mid-1930s, there were around 20 amateur radio operators in India. Amateur radio operators played an important part in the Indian independence movement with the establishment of illegal pro-independence radio stations in the 1940s. Manual fire alarm activation It is, however, possible for call points/pull stations to be used in conjunction with automatic detection as part of the overall fire detection and alarm system. Manual fire alarm activation requires human intervention, as distinct from automatic fire alarm activation such as that provided through the use of heat detectors and smoke detectors. Systems in completed buildings tend to be wired in and include a control panel. This usually causes the alarm to sound the evacuation signal for the relevant building or zone. Each station is classified by the service in which it operates, permanently or temporarily. Ship station requirements may be established by law or international treaty. For instance large cargo ships traveling the open seas may be required to have long-distance communications equipment, whereas coastal ship may only need short range communications. Operating such stations may require a license. 27467a3929 Nets operate either on schedule or continuously (continuous watch). Nets operating on schedule handle traffic only at definite, prearranged times and in accordance with a prearranged schedule of intercommunication. Nets operating continuously are prepared to handle traffic at any time; they maintain operators on duty at all stations in the net at all times. National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST), under the oversight of its Time and Frequency Division, which is part of NIST's Physical Measurement Laboratory based in Gaithersburg, Maryland. S. WWV is a shortwave ("high frequency" or HF) radio station, located near Fort Collins, Colorado. The letters WWV are only a call sign and do not stand for anything (see below). It has broadcast a continuous time signal since 1945, and implements United States government frequency standards, with transmitters operating on 2. 5, 5, 10, 15, 20, and 25 MHz. WWV is operated by the U 27467a3929
