Tripwire force present an offensive threat, it can be deployed without triggering the security dilemma. The term "glass plate" has been used as a synonym for tripwire force; A tripwire force (sometimes called a glass plate) is a strategic approach in deterrence theory whereby a small force is deployed abroad with the assumption that an attack on them will trigger a greater deployment of forces. The deployment of the small force is designed to signal the defending side's commitment to an armed response to future aggression without triggering a security spiral 264a6dfc21
