

Unwanted Advances Sexual Paranoia Comes To Campus

Laura Kipnis's 2017 book, *Unwanted Advances: Sexual Paranoia Comes to Campus* discusses the Ludlow case and argues that sexual harassment policies do not protect students. Laura Kipnis (born 1956) is an American cultural critic, essayist, educator, and former video artist. In recent years she has become known for debating sexual harassment, and free speech policies in higher education. Her work focuses on sexual politics, gender issues, aesthetics, popular culture, and pornography. She is professor emerita of media studies at Northwestern University in the department of radio-TV-film, where she teaches filmmaking. She began her career as a video artist, exploring similar themes in the form of video essays.

Cultural idealization of thinness is believed to contribute to some eating disorders. These disorders do not include obesity. According to the founder of Stop Street Harassment, it can range from physically harmless behavior, such as "kissing noises", "stares", and "non-sexually explicit..."

Tuerkheimer reviewed the literature on rape allegations, and reported on the problems surrounding the credibility of rape victims, and how that relates to false rape accusations. She pointed to national survey data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention that indicates 1 in every 5 women and 1 in 71 men will be raped during their lifetime at some point. Despite the prevalence of rape and the fact that false rape allegations are rare, Tuerkheimer reported that law... Kipnis was born in Chicago, Illinois. She has received fellowships for her work from the Guggenheim Foundation, the Rockefeller Foundation, the Michigan Society of Fellows, and the National Endowment for the Arts. In her early career she worked as a video artist. A student who had brought a Title IX complaint discussed at length in the book filed a lawsuit against Kipnis and her publisher, HarperCollins, alleging invasion of privacy, defamation, and other charges relating to the book. The case was settled. Kipnis has publicly stated, "In case there's any confusion, Unwanted Advances remains in print and I stand by everything in the book." Unwanted Advances was named one of The Wall Street Journal's Ten Best Non-Fiction Books of 2017. Senator Birch Bayh wrote the 37 opening words of Title IX. Bayh first introduced an amendment to the Higher Education Act to ban discrimination on the basis of sex on August 6, 1971, and again on February 28, 1972, when it passed the Senate. Representative Edith Green, chair of the Subcommittee on Education, had held hearings on discrimination against women, and introduced legislation in the House on May 11, 1972. The full Congress passed Title IX on June 8, 1972. Representative Patsy Mink emerged in the House to lead efforts to protect Title IX against attempts to weaken it, and it was later renamed the Patsy T. Mink Equal Opportunity in Education Act following Mink's death in 2002. When Title IX was passed in 1972, 42 percent of the students enrolled in American colleges were female.
