Deliverable-oriented WBS, also known as Product breakdown structure uses key deliverables A work-breakdown structure (WBS) in project management and systems engineering is a breakdown of a project into smaller components

A WBS provides the necessary framework for detailed cost estimation and control while providing guidance for schedule development and control.

Neurons communicate with other cells via synapses, which are specialized connections that commonly use minute amounts of chemical neurotransmitters to pass the electric signal from the presynaptic neuron to the target cell through the synaptic gap

From the inflow to the outflow, the tubular heart consists of sinus venosus, primitive atrium, the primitive ventricle, the bulbus cordis, and truncus arteriosus. The sinus venosus will become part of the right atrium and contain the primary cardiac pacemaker. The primitive atrium and primitive ventricle will develop into the upper and lower chambers of the heart. The bulbus cordis will form part of the right ventricle, while the truncus arteriosus split into pulmonary and aortic vessels that carry blood away from the heart. If a cell dies, the body will remove it and replace it with Cell damage (also known as cell injury) is a variety of changes of stress that a cell suffers due to external as well as internal environmental changes. Amongst other causes, this can be due to physical, chemical, infectious, biological, nutritional or immunological factors. Cell death occurs when the severity of the injury exceeds the cell's ability to repair itself.
