Phenytoin Its therapeutic range for both anticonvulsant and antiarrhythmic effect is Phenytoin (PHT), sold under the brand name Dilantin among others, is an anti-seizure medication. The intravenous form, fosphenytoin, is used for status epilepticus that does not improve with benzodiazepines. It is useful for the prevention of tonic-clonic seizures (also known as grand mal seizures) and focal seizures, but not absence seizures. The intravenous form generally begins working within 30 minutes and is effective for roughly 24 hours. Second choice drug to carbamazepine. Phenytoin has a narrow therapeutic index. It can be taken intravenously or by mouth. Blood levels can be measured to determine the proper dose. It may also be used for certain heart arrhythmias or neuropathic pain 0a3dc01f38
