Mining Mining in a wider sense includes extraction of any non-renewable resource such as petroleum, natural gas, or even water. Since Mining is the extraction of valuable geological materials and minerals from the surface of the Earth. Mining is required to obtain most materials that cannot be grown through agricultural processes, or feasibly created artificially in a laboratory or factory. Mining can also perpetuate political instability through resource conflicts. The ore must be a rock or mineral that contains valuable constituent, can be extracted or mined and sold for profit. contributes to local human rights violations and environmental conflicts.
