Beginning with A Treatise of Human Nature (1739–40), Hume strove to create a naturalistic science of man that examined the psychological basis of human nature. This places him with Francis Bacon, Thomas Hobbes, John Locke, and George Berkeley as an empiricist. “person”, or “mind” refer to collections of “sense-contents”. Hume followed John Locke in rejecting the existence of innate ideas, concluding that all human knowledge derives solely from experience
