Muslims regard the Israelites, to whom Jews and Samaritans trace their ethnic ancestry, as an important religious concept; they are referenced around 43 times in the Quran, excluding individual prophets, and in many accounts of hadith. Historically it was common practice in societies of the Mediterranean and Ancient Near East for the owners of slaves to have sexual relations with individuals considered their property. This fact persisted, with distinct legal differences, among the three major Abrahamic religions, from antiquity. Standing in contrast to modern interpretations of Islamic law, traditionalist interpretations historically permitted men to have sexual relations with their female slaves, while at the same time affording affected female slaves a variety of different rights and privileges, whose scope varied over different periods. An example is the status of umm al-walad, which could be granted to a concubine who gave birth to a child whose paternity was acknowledged by the slave owner. Apostasy in Islam An apostate from Islam is known as a murtadd (مرتد). It includes not only explicit apostasy, renunciations of the Islamic faith by converting to another religion or abandoning religion altogether, but also blasphemy or heresy by those who consider themselves Muslims, through any action or utterance which implies unbelief, including those who deny a "fundamental tenet or creed" of Islam.
