In college mathematics exercises often depend on functions of a real variable or application of theorems. Another exercise is completing the square in a quadratic polynomial. Early exercises deal with addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division of integers. Mathematics teachers assign mathematical exercises to develop the skills of their students.
