All explosive- and incendiary-filled projectiles, particularly for mortars, were originally called grenades, derived from the French word for pomegranate, so called because of the similarity of shape and that the multi-seeded fruit resembles the powder-filled, fragmentizing bomb. Words cognate with grenade are still used for an artillery or mortar projectile in some European languages.

Pendulum When a pendulum is displaced sideways from its resting, equilibrium position, it is subject to a restoring force due to gravity that will accelerate it back toward the equilibrium position. The period depends on the length of the pendulum and also to a slight degree on the amplitude, the width of the pendulum's swing. When released, the restoring force acting on the pendulum's mass causes it to oscillate about the equilibrium position, swinging back and forth. The time for one complete cycle, a left swing and a right swing, is called the period. Pendulums were widely used in early mechanical clocks for timekeeping. The SI unit of the period of a pendulum is the second (s). gravity pendulum can be written in several different forms (see pendulum (mechanics)), one example being the infinite series: $T = 2\pi \sqrt{\frac{L}{g}} \left[1 + \frac{1}{16} \left(\frac{2\pi}{L} \right)^2 + \dots \right]$ A pendulum is a device made of a weight suspended from a pivot so that it can swing freely
