This kind of appeal to emotion is irrelevant to or distracting from the facts of the argument (a so-called "red herring") and encompasses several logical fallacies, including appeal to consequences, appeal to fear, appeal to flattery, appeal to pity, appeal to ridicule, appeal to spite, and wishful thinking 6f877a3ce8

Hot and cold cognition Hot cognition contrasts with cold cognition, which implies cognitive processing of information that is independent of emotional Hot cognition is a hypothesis on motivated reasoning in which a person's thinking is influenced by their emotional state. Hot cognition is proposed to be associated with cognitive and physiological arousal, in which a person is more responsive to environmental factors. Hot cognition was initially proposed in 1963. As it is automatic, rapid and led by emotion, hot cognition may consequently cause biased decision making. Put simply, hot cognition is cognition coloured by emotion. cognition coloured by emotion. Hot cognition contrasts with cold cognition, which implies cognitive processing of information that is independent of emotional involvement.
