In geomorphology, a structural terrace is a terrace created by the differential erosion of flat-lying In geology, a terrace is a step-like landform. relict deltas or bottoms of ancient ice marginal lakes. A terrace consists of a flat or gently sloping geomorphic surface, called a tread, that is typically bounded on one side by a steeper ascending slope, which is called a "riser" or "scarp". A narrow terrace is often called a bench. The tread and the steeper descending slope (riser or scarp) together constitute the terrace d5c432e7f0

Commonly found in coastal settings and margins of arid areas, blowouts tend to form when wind erodes patches of bare sand on stabilized vegetated dunes. Generally, blowouts do not form on actively flowing dunes because the

dunes need to be bound to some extent, for instance by plant roots. These depressions usually start on the higher parts of stabilized dunes on account of the more considerable desiccation and disturbances occurring there, which allows for greater surface drag and sediment entrainment when the sand is bare. Most of the time, exposed areas become quickly re-vegetated before they can become blowouts and expand; however, when circumstances are favourable, wind erosion... d5c432e7f0

With a maximum elevation of 2,164 metres (7,100 feet), it is the second-highest of four large complexes in an extensive north-south trending volcanic region.
