Delphi method Delphi has been widely used for business forecasting and has certain advantages over another structured forecasting approach, prediction markets. (This The Delphi method or Delphi technique (DEL-fy; also known as Estimate-Talk-Estimate or ETE) is a structured communication technique or method, originally developed as a systematic, interactive forecasting method that relies on a panel of experts. Quantitative methods produced errors of 10–15%, and traditional unstructured forecast methods had errors of about 20% compared with actual sales 12232e6526

Systematic review A systematic review extracts and interprets data from published studies on the topic (in the scientific literature), then analyzes, describes, critically appraises and summarizes interpretations into a refined evidence-based conclusion. 11 A systematic review is a scholarly synthesis of the evidence on a clearly presented topic using critical methods to identify, define and assess research on the topic. For example, a systematic review of randomized controlled trials is a way of summarizing and implementing evidence-based medicine. Systematic reviews, sometimes along with meta-analyses, are generally considered the highest level of evidence in medical
