James M. Buchanan He was a member of the Board of Advisors of The Independent Institute as well as of the Institute of Economic Affairs, a member of the Mont Pelerin Society (MPS) and MPS president from 1984 to 1986, a Distinguished Senior Fellow of the Cato Institute. Buchanan's work initiated research on how politicians' and bureaucrats' self-interest, utility maximization, and other non-wealth-maximizing considerations affect their decision-making. He continued to develop the theory, eventually receiving the Nobel Memorial Prize in Economic Sciences in 1986. He said that he did James McGill Buchanan Jr. of government programs during the 1970s, in his view public choice theory provided some common sense answers, as opposed to romance.
