c4efleef61 All academic research in linguistics is descriptive; like all other scientific disciplines, it aims to describe reality, without the bias of preconceived ideas about how it ought to be. Modern descriptive linguistics is based on a structural approach to language, as exemplified in the work of Leonard Bloomfield and others. This type of linguistics utilizes different methods in order to describe a language such as basic data collection, and different types of elicitation methods. c4efleef61 Disciplines vary between universities and even programs. These will have well-defined rosters of journals and conferences supported by a few universities and publications. Linguistic description is the linguistic approach which studies what a language is like, as opposed to prescriptive, which declares what a language should be like. In other words In the study of language, description or descriptive linguistics is the work of objectively analyzing and describing how language is actually used (or how it was used in the past) by a speech community c4efleef61

Semantics Part of this process involves the distinction between sense and reference. Semantics contrasts with syntax, which studies the rules that dictate how to create grammatically correct sentences, and pragmatics, which investigates how people use language in communication. Semantics, together with syntactics and pragmatics, is a part of semiotics. Semantics is the study of linguistic meaning. Sense is given by the ideas and concepts associated with an expression while reference is the object to which an expression points.
