Alfred Adler He proposed that contributing to others (social interest or Gemeinschaftsgefühl) was how the individual feels a sense of worth and belonging in the family and society. Alfred Adler considered a human being as an individual whole, and therefore he called his school of psychology "individual. articles. His emphasis on the importance of feelings of belonging, relationships within the family, and birth order set him apart from Freud and others in their common circle.
