Vadding is a verb which has become synonymous with urban exploration. The word comes from MIT where, for a time in the late 1970s, some of the student population spent significant time playing a computer game called *ADVENT* (also known as *Colossal Cave Adventure*). In an attempt to hide the game from system administrators... Originally, Tad Williams conceived *Shadowmarch* as an idea for a fantasy movie, and later a fantasy TV series, which has been described as "Hill Street Blues meets *Babylon 5* meets *Lord of the Rings*". When both of these options fell through, *Shadowmarch* was reborn as an online serial. It was later released between June 2001 and August 2002 in bi-weekly episodes, but the lack of subscribers willing to pay the one-time \$14.99 fee necessary to read chapters beyond the five initial free ones meant that after the first year, the online project halted, with the completed first novel (and subsequent volumes... *Fleur* (played by Cherry Ngan), who grew up in her family's traditional tofu shop, has loved dancing since she was young.
