Wound Badge In 1957, the West German government authorized a denazified (Swastika removed) version of the basic (black, silver, and gold) badges for wear on the Bundeswehr uniform, among other certain Nazi-era wartime awards. After March 1943, due to the increasing number of Allied bombings, it was also awarded to civilians wounded in air raids. It was awarded when the wound was the result of enemy hostile action. The Wound Badge (German: Verwundetenabzeichen) was a German military decoration first promulgated by Wilhelm II, German Emperor on 3 March 1918, which The Wound Badge (German: Verwundetenabzeichen) was a German military decoration first promulgated by Wilhelm II, German Emperor on 3 March 1918, which was first awarded to soldiers of the German Army who were wounded during World War I. In September 1939, Adolf Hitler reinstated the award, with the major change being the helmet. The style of the helmet was changed from the one used in World War I to the 1935 pattern helmet. During World War II, it

was awarded to members in the Wehrmacht, Schutzstaffel (SS) and the auxiliary service organizations. Between the world wars, it was awarded to members of the German armed forces who fought on the Nationalist side of the Spanish Civil War, 1938-39, and received combat-related wounds 1958e3b882

In 1917 a new badge was created. 1958e3b882 == Medieval usage == 1958e3b882 The CIB and its non-combat contemporary, the Expert Infantryman Badge (EIB), were created in November 1943 during World War II to boost morale and increase the prestige of infantry service. It recognizes the inherent danger and sacrifice of infantrymen, who face greater risk of being becoming a casualty than

any other military occupational specialty. Badges worn on clothing were common in the late Middle Ages, particularly in England. They could be made of base metal, cloth or other materials and worn on the clothing of the followers of the person in question; grander forms would be worn by important persons, with the Dunstable Swan Jewel in enamelled gold a rare survivor. Livery collars were also given to important persons, often with the badge as a pendant. The badge would also be embroidered or appliqued on standards, horse trappings, livery uniforms, and other belongings. Many medieval badges survive in English pub names. Cap badges are a modern form of heraldry and their design generally incorporates highly symbolic devices. Some badges that contain images of lions or other cats are sometimes informally referred to as cat badges. == Instances in military forces ==

The merit badge award is represented by a circular patch with an image representing the badge's topic. The patches for the Eagle Scout-required merit badges are distinguishable by the silver border on the outside edge. Merit badges are displayed on a sash which can be worn with the

Scouts BSA uniform on formal occasions. The National Council reviews and updates badges each year.
